# USFS Infrastructure Law Fish Passage Funding Programs

- Legacy Roads & Trails Remediation (LRT)
- Collaborative-based Aquatic-focused Landscape-scale Restoration (CALR)
- Dam Decommissioning





## Legacy Roads & Trails Remediation

- \$250 Million over 5 years
- Criteria:
  - Aquatic passage
  - Threatened/endangered species, NFHP priority species
  - Reducing sediment impacts
  - Increasing climate resilience
  - Source water protection
- Project types:
  - AOPs, road decommissioning, road and trail relocation





# FY22, FY23 Legacy Roads & Trails Remediation

- \$40 Million allocated in FY22
- 120 Projects across all USFS Regions
- EBTJV range 15 projects, 37 miles reconnected, \$1.3 Million

- FY23
- 100 projects across all Regions
- EBTJV range similar to FY22





# Collaborative Aquatic Landscape Restoration Program (CALR)

#### Authorized \$80 over 5 years

- Criteria:
  - Fish passage
  - Miles of water quality improved
  - On federal, tribal & non-federal lands
- Project types:
  - Culvert upgrades, dam removals, irrigation weir retrofits, habitat or water quality improvements





# CALR FY22/FY23 projects

- \$25 Million committed to 11 projects in FY22.
- An additional \$29 Million committed to 10 projects in FY23.
- No Eastern Brook Trout Projects
- AOP dam removal, culvert and irrigation diversion projects will restore
  - 277 miles for fish and aquatic organism passage.
  - 337 miles improved for water quality.



### Dam Decommissioning

- \$10 Million over 5 years
- Criteria:
  - USFS owned
  - Non-hydropower
  - High hazard
- Project types:
  - Dam decommissioning focused on 5-10 high hazard dams





# Trout Unlimited Keystone Agreement

- \$40 Million over 4 years
- AOP, stream and watershed restoration, abandoned mineland restoration
- 170 or so individual projects across all 9 US Forest Service Regions
- Eastern Brook Trout 9 National Forests
- ~ 30 brook trout projects planned
